#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE - END OF DAY COLLECTION**

#### **IMPORTANT NOTICE - ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL**

# YEAR GROUP UPDATES / NOTICES

#### **NURSERY**

Our topic this term was called 'Marvellous Me'. We learnt lots about ourselves and our families. We created family trees, drew and painted self-portraits, explored our five senses and learnt about feelings/emotions. We also learnt about healthy eating and discussed the food we like and dislike.

Each week this term, the children have been learning a new nursery rhyme and took part in decorating the character using different materials. At the end of term, your child will come home with a nursery rhymes pack, please practice these at home with your children. The fun nursery rhymes will support children's communication and language development.

Please remember to send your child in a coat, bag of spare clothes and a water bottle and don't forget to name the children's belongings. Thank you.

#### **RECEPTION**

This term, Reception have been busy exploring some wonderful stories, including *The Gruffalo*, We're Going on a Bear Hunt, and Where's My Teddy? Alongside these favourites, we've also enjoyed non-fiction books such as Eyes, Nose, Belly, Toes, which helped us learn around how our bodies move, and *The Senses*, which helped us learn all about our senses and how they work. The children especially loved taking part in a taste test to discover how we use our sense of taste!

We've also been learning about where we live and celebrating the many different languages spoken around the world and within our own classroom. In maths, we've been exploring the sizes of different objects and creating our own 2- and 3-colour repeating patterns. It's been a busy and exciting time of learning and discovery in Reception!

#### YEAR 1

Year 1 have had a fantastic term filled with exciting learning across all subjects! In English, we have enjoyed reading *The Rainbow Fish*, *Peace at Last*, *Can't You Sleep*, *Little Bear*? and *Six Dinner Sid*. These wonderful stories have inspired our writing and discussions about friendship, kindness, and caring for others.

In Maths, we have been focusing on addition and subtraction, using dienes, number lines, counters, and part–part–whole models to help us solve problems and explain our thinking.

In History, we've been exploring how childhood has changed over time, looking closely at toys and clothes from the past and comparing them with those we have today.

In Science, we've been learning about the weather, the seasons, and plants — and we even got to dissect and label the different parts of a flower! It's been a busy and fun-filled term of curiosity and discovery for our Year 1 children.

#### YEAR 2

Year 2 have had an exciting term. We have been reading The Proudest Blue, Hansel and Gretel and The Wizard of Oz. We have used these books which we have read to help us with our writing, where we have been retelling stories and describing characters and settings. In Maths, we have been focussing on addition and subtraction with two-digit numbers. We have practised using dienes, multilink and our part-whole models to help us with this. In History, we have been looking at how trade has changed the foods we have in the UK today. We looked at how Christopher Columbus discovered The Americas, and how he discovered many exotic foods, which we eat lots of today! Science this term has been incredibly exciting. We have looked at plants and seeds, we have grown our own cress seeds and seen how these have grown. We have also been on a woodland walk, where we identified different trees and used a tally chart to record how many times we saw each species of tree.

#### YEAR 3

In 3S this term we have started learning French. We are very enthusiastic as a class about our French lessons and thoroughly enjoy having simple conversations together. Do ask the children to say 'Hello' and ask 'How are you?' in French as we practice this every week and are excellent at this!

We are also working hard in our maths lessons. So far this term we have worked on number sense, place value and graphs.

In shared reading we have just finished our first book called 'The fastest boy in the world', and are moving onto our new book, 'The Twits' by Roald Dahl!

In our science lessons we have been learning all about states of matter and how we can observe these changes taking place. It has been a busy first term for Year 3, but it has also been one filled with lots of positive learning opportunities and experiences!

#### YEAR 4

A huge thank you to **Gainsborough Library** for hosting our visit! The children had a brilliant time taking part in a creative activity.

Our pupils got straight into the fun, joining in enthusiastically with the interactive session before, of course, borrowing lots of exciting new books to enjoy. Happy reading, everyone! This visit was perfectly timed, coming right after we finished our shared reading book, 'Emil and the Detectives.' The class thoroughly enjoyed reading about young Emil, who travels alone to Berlin only to have his money stolen on the train! It was a fantastic story of courage, resourcefulness, and teamwork as Emil and his gang of new friends work together to catch the thief.

#### YEAR 5

Year 5 has been learning all about the human body, focusing on the circulatory system. We carried out a fun and slightly messy experiment to explore what blood is made of — using coloured water, smarties, marshmallows, and raspberries to represent plasma, platelets, white and red blood cells! We also discovered how our **double circulatory system** works, with blood travelling from the heart to the lungs and then around the rest of the body.

In English, we're nearly at the end of our class book *Cirque du Freak* — four chapters to go! The suspense is building, and we can't wait to find out what happens next! Year 5 has had a fantastic two weeks of learning through science and storytelling.

#### YEAR 6

Year 6 had an amazing time this week on their residential trip. Children were able to take part in a variety of activities including; bushcraft, abseiling, high ropes, archery and fire starting! The pupils showed our core values of excellence, integrity and community representing PVPA well.

Year 6 have also been learning all about the industrial revolution in history this half term and did some brilliant writing on the impacts it had on Britain. Fantastic job year 6!

A reminder to all year 6 parents that the deadline is fast approaching for parents to register their child for secondary school, please ensure this is done ASAP.

#### SEU1

SEU 1 has had a busy and exciting few weeks! In Science, we've been learning about plants and have planted our own bean seeds to observe their growth. Reception students focused on the "Marvelous Me" topic, exploring themselves and their families, while Year 1 delved into history to see how childhood has changed over time.

Year 2 has been learning about Food and Trade, discovering the origins of different foods. Our recent Food Technology lesson was a delicious success! Linking to our shared reading story, "Handa's Surprise," we made fruit skewers. The children had a wonderful time using their senses, actively exploring the fruit by smelling, feeling the textures, and, of course, tasting them.

PE sessions have been a major highlight, especially gymnastics, as the children enjoy climbing the apparatus, balancing, and swinging.

Please ensure you check Tapestry daily for regular updates and photos of all the great learning happening in SEU 1.

### SEU2

In SEU2, we have been exploring the concepts of big and small using a variety of everyday visual objects. The children have also been enjoying messy play and developing their fine motor skills through activities like gloop and moon sand. They've been using different tools to manipulate textures while learning visual key words to describe the actions they're using.

The children have been engaging well during Bucket Time and have shown great interest in the story "Where's My Teddy?". This inspired some fantastic artwork, including creating their own teddy bears using food, which encouraged sensory exploration and trying new foods.

We've also been singing our favourite family songs and creating beautiful family trees featuring photos of loved ones. As a special project, the children made picture frames in art to display their family photos, which they proudly took home to share with their families.

#### SEU3

We've had a busy and wonderfully productive few weeks in SEU 3, exploring some exciting topics and working hard on our core skills.

The world of plants and seasons has been our main focus in science. The children have loved our hands-on activities, including "Plant Art" and "Growing from Seed." We are all excited to observe the amazing changes as these plants grow over the next few weeks!

We are working hard on our fine motor skills each day. The children have been practicing letter formation and using scissors with greater accuracy. These essential tabletop activities are great for strengthening their hand muscles and improving precision. Our PE sessions have focused on ball skills. The children are really enjoying practicing catching and throwing to one another, which is excellent for improving their hand-eye coordination. We will be continuing to explore emotions each week, as well as focusing on art and creativity.

#### **MUSIC**

After half term we will be recording our charity christmas song 'Christmas Jumper Day' in aid of Save the children.
